HISTORY & MISSION

In the early 1980s, prior to the ground-breaking of Bayside Marketplace, the City of Miami and Bayside Marketplace developer Jim Rouse began discussing ideas for an organization that would support minority entrepreneurs in the City of Miami. In 1986, MBF was created from this partnership as a means to revitalize and serve the City of Miami's downtown economic core. Currently, MBF advances economic development throughout Miami-Dade County through the support of minority businesses and education.

MBF provides minority and women-owned businesses in Miami access to funds through its loan programs. It also provides valuable business tools and resources, such as counseling and training in business development and management and other related services, through its Small Business Training and workshops and through partnerships with local community organizations also engaged in economic development.

MBF supports education for minority students through its vocational and educational scholarships and grants. MBF currently has scholarship endowments at Miami Dade College, Florida International University (FIU), and Florida Memorial University (FMU). It also supports Breakthrough Miami, the Network for Teaching Entrepreneurship (NFTE), the Golden Scholars Program at FIU, the Education Fund, St. Alban's Child Enrichment Center, the YWCA, and the Little Haiti Optimist Club among others. It has created a scholarship program for all City of Miami Public high schools and for students at George T. Baker Aviation Technical College and Lindsey Hopkins Technical College.

OUR MISSION

MBF is a nonprofit organization designed to advance economic development in Miami through the support of minority businesses and education.

MBF seeks to do this through the creation and administration of loan programs for minority businesses, through the creation of programs and educational scholarships for minorities, and by providing technical assistance to minority-owned businesses.

LOAN PROGRAMS

History: In 2011, MBF created a loan program to provide loans of \$10,000 to \$50,000 to City of Miami minority-owned businesses. In 2013, seeing the need for smaller loans with a simpler underwriting process, it launched a microloan program with loans from \$2,500 to \$10,000. In 2014, MBF partnered with Enterprise Florida, Inc. (EFI) and through their State Small Business Initiative Loan Participation Program, MBF has been able to provide loans of up to \$100,000.

Since 2011, the Miami Bayside Foundation has awarded 139 loans totaling more 7.2 million.

In 2016, prompted by the adverse effects of the Zika virus on businesses in certain areas of the City of Miami, MBF created the ZEAL (Zika Emergency Assistance Loan) program to ensure retention of jobs. In 2017, MBF raised its maximum loan to \$75,000, or \$150,000 with Enterprise Florida's participation. In 2018, was chosen as development partner by the State of Florida's Department of Economic Opportunity to administer their Black Business Loan Program in Miami-Dade County. During 2020, MBF began working with Florida First Capital Finance Corporation on loan participations.

All the loan programs aim to stimulate economic development in Miami by helping minority-owned businesses grow and create or maintain jobs. Since 2011, the Miami Bayside Foundation has awarded 109 loans totaling more than \$5.3 million to minorityowned businesses in the Miami helping create more than 450 jobs.

2020 was a very challenging year for our community. Minorityowned small businesses were particularly hard-hit by the COVID-19 pandemic. MBF worked closely with their clients and with community partners to meet the surge in demand for financial relief. MBF partnered with the Dade County Federal Credit Union and two other CDFI's (Ascendus and BBIF) to manage Miami-Dade County's RISE Miami-Dade Fund program, which made loans of \$30,0000 available to small businesses that had not benefitted from prior COVID relief funds. A total of 890 loans were funded for \$18.3M during a six-month period; 428 of those were processed by MBF for a total of \$8.6M.





TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

SMALL BUSINESS TRAINING

In 2020, MBF held two virtual series of 15-session **Small Business Training (SBT)** workshops for minority-owned business. SBT workshops provide business owners with essential tools and skills to grow their companies including compliance, intellectual property, hiring, policies and procedures, real estate, contracts, direct sales and marketing, bookkeeping, finances, minority certification, and accessing capital. Each session consists of two hours of training and discussion. Each specialty is taught by an expert in that field. In 2020, fifty-eight participants graduated from MBF's Small Business Training. A total of 373 have graduated to date.

In 2018, seeing the need for more in-depth training in some of the subjects covered in the SBT workshops, MBF partnered with SBDC at FIU to hold a series of four **in-depth financial workshops** and **three in-depth marketing workshops**. In 2020, forty-five entrepreneurs completed these workshops with a total to date of 225.

TRUIST/MBF DIGITAL MARKETING SERIES

In September 2020, MBF, in partnership with the Truist Foundation, launched an in-depth training program aimed at empowering minority owned businesses, impacted by COVID-19, to use digital marketing to pivot and grow their businesses. Two cohorts, each made up of 35 small business owners, were selected to participate in this program.

Program participants attended twenty-eight hours of virtual sessions on the following seven topics: Marketing Principles, Marketing Strategies, Amazon, Website, LinkedIn, Instagram, and Facebook. After completion of the sessions, program participants received one-on-one mentoring sessions with their choice of three of the five platform experts. A total of 467 hours of one-on-one mentoring were completed.



Upon successful competition of the virtual sessions and one-on-one mentoring, The Truist Foundation awarded each small business a grant they could use for digital marketing implementation. Alongside digital marketing experts, grants were invested in website design, Instagram and Facebook clean-up, video creation, and other valuable digital marketing services. Over \$250,000 in grants were awarded for implementation.

EDUCATION

FLORIDA INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY

Florida International University (FIU) is Miami's first and only public research university offering Bachelors, Masters, and Doctoral degrees. In 2011, MBF created the **Miami Bayside Foundation Scholarship Endowment at FIU** to support minority students residing in the City of Miami and interested in entrepreneurship. That same year, it gifted \$100,000 to the **First Generation Scholarship Fund**, matched by the State of Florida to create a \$200,000 total gift to be used over 10 years.

In April 2013, MBF presented a \$200,000 gift to FIU's College of Business to create its first MBA scholarship endowment, the **Miami Bayside Foundation MBA Scholarship Endowment**. The endowment benefits City of Miami residents enrolled in FIU's MBA programs at FIU Downtown on Brickell.

In 2014, MBF awarded its first gift in support of FIU's **Golden Scholars** program. The program is an intensive, alternative, residential admissions program which serves as an obtainable gateway for underrepresented, first generation student populations who may not meet the general criteria for undergraduate admissions. It also ensures that these students graduate, through continuous monitoring and mentoring. MBF has awarded \$800,000 to this program.

During 2020, MBF awarded 107 scholarships to FIU students for a total of \$220,550.

MIAMI DADE COLLEGE



Miami Dade College was created with the idea that anyone with a desire to get a college degree should be given that opportunity. Today, more than 100,000 students attend Miami Dade College, a state-supported college with eight campuses and numerous outreach centers. MDC is the second-largest college or university in the United States.

In 1998, MBF created an endowment at Miami Dade College for the purpose of awarding scholarships to minority students who reside in the City of Miami. Since then, 553 scholarships have been awarded for a total of \$485,713. In 2020, fifty-eight scholarships were awarded for a total of \$53,000.

FLORIDA MEMORIAL UNIVERSITY



Florida Memorial University (FMU) is South Florida's only Historically Black College or University (HBCU). FMU endeavors to instill in students the importance of becoming global citizens through lifelong learning, leadership, character, and service that will enhance their lives and the lives of others.

In 2012, MBF made a \$200,000 gift to FMU to create a scholarship endowment for minority students who are residents of Miami and interested in entrepreneurship. In 2020, two scholarships were awarded to Douana Compere - Biology and Myrlandie Myrbel – Law & Government. Both students are graduates of Miami Edison Senior High School.



MIAMI-DADE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS



In May 2020, Miami Bayside Foundation awarded \$1,000 scholarships to 42 City of Miami residents graduating from Miami-Dade County Public Schools and attending college in the fall. Seven of these scholarships were furnished by the Commissioner Willy Gort Scholarship Program. This was the seventh year of a multi-year scholarship program commitment made by MBF to Miami-Dade County Public Schools.

The 42 scholarship recipients represented the following schools - Booker T. Washington High School, Coral Gables Senior High School, iPrep Academy, iTech @ Thomas A. Edison Educational Center, Miami Edison High School, Miami Jackson High School, Miami Northwestern Senior High School, Miami Senior High School, and School for Advanced Studies-Wolfson.

TECHNICAL COLLEGES (George T. Baker, Lindsey Hopkins)

In 2015, MBF launched a scholarship program for City of Miami students at Miami-Dade Public School System technical colleges and created its first co-named scholarship in partnership with Baptist Health South Florida for students at D.A. Dorsey Technical College. To date, MBF's and Baptist's gifts have covered 323 scholarships to City of Miami minority students at **D.A. Dorsey, Lindsey Hopkins, and George T. Baker Aviation technical colleges**. The scholarships are for students in programs with high job placement rates such as Aircraft Maintenance, Avionics Technician, Automotive Service Technician, Practical Nursing, Pharmacy Technician, Patient Care Technician and other programs.

GEORGE T. BAKER AVIATION TECHNICAL COLLEGE

George T. Baker Aviation Technical College provides occupational training to high school and adult students for careers in aviation maintenance, electronics, and avionics. Since its inception in 1939, thousands of students have been trained for careers in aviation. George T. Baker's goal is for all students to become program completers, technologically proficient, and obtain employment upon completion of a program. In 2019, twelve scholarships were awarded to students at George T. Baker Aviation Technical College.

Due to COVID-19, most programs at George T. Baker Aviation Technical College were suspended. Online learning was not made available because of the nature of their hands-on instruction. American Airlines also suspended all visits/instruction from George T. Baker students.

LINDSEY HOPKINS TECHNICAL COLLEGE



Lindsey Hopkins Technical College was the first career and technical education center built in Miami-Dade County. The school serves more than 10,000 students each year through its English language courses, adult educational programs, and career and technical programs in Health Science, Automotive Technology, Electricity, Heating and Air Conditioning, Fashion Design, Culinary Arts and Commercial Foods, Nutrition and Dietary Management, Computer Technology, Commercial Arts, Early Childhood Education, and Nails and Facials Specialty. Through its dual enrollment program, the school also provides technical and career training for high-school students enrolled at 10 local high schools. In 2019, MBF awarded seven scholarships to Lindsey Hopkins Technical College students.

Lindsey Hopkins Technical College experienced a large drop in enrollment because of COVID-19. No scholarships were awarded in 2020; however, there are plans to continue our scholarship support in the coming year.

COMMISSIONER WILLY GORT SCHOLARSHIP

In 2016, Commissioner Willy Gort granted MBF funds from his Anti-Poverty Initiative Funds to provide scholarships, including tuition assistance and stipends, for residents in District 1 pursuing technical education programs and associate degrees with high job placement rates at Miami Dade College, Lindsey Hopkins Technical College, and George T. Baker Aviation Technical College. Subsequently, Commissioner Gort very generously granted his API funds to MBF in 2017 and again in 2019. Gort Scholarships are also awarded to graduating high school (M-DCPS) seniors attending college.



BREAKTHROUGH MIAMI

In 2012, MBF formed an educational partnership with Breakthrough Miami, awarding a gift of \$50,000 to be disbursed over five years. In 2018, MBF renewed its commitment to Breakthrough with a second five-year \$50,000 gift. Breakthrough Miami is an award-wining organization that provides a tuition-free, eight-year academic enrichment program to motivated students from disadvantaged communities in the 5th to 12th grades.

Over the past eight years 85% of Breakthrough Scholars continued through the second year of college, a key benchmark in college completion.

Breakthrough was able to continue serving all students remotely and to deliver high quality virtual teaching to meet the evolving needs of students and families. Eighty one percent of Breakthrough scholars reported being prepared for virtual learning for the upcoming school year due to Breakthrough Miami Summer Institute and 83% reported Breakthrough exposed them to opportunities they would not receive in school.

NETWORK FOR TEACHING ENTREPRENEURSHIP, INC. (NFTE)

In 2013, MBF awarded a gift of \$50,000 to Network for Teaching Entrepreneurship, Inc. (NFTE), an internationally recognized organization that provides programs meant to inspire students from low-income communities to stay in school, to recognize business opportunities and to plan successful futures. The funds were allocated over the course of five years to NFTE programs benefiting 100 students each year at Booker T. Washington Senior High School in the City of Miami. In 2018, MBF reaffirmed its commitment to NFTE with a \$25,000 five-year award to help fund its E2 (Advanced Entrepreneurship) program at Miami Edison Senior High School.

During the 2019-2020 school year, a total of 75 students at Miami Edison Senior High School completed the E2 program. All 75 students enrolled in the program completed the program despite various technological challenges. Within this group, 80% of the students completed a business plan and presented this plan at their school-based pitch competition.

The most significant challenge NFTE faced in 2020 was determining how to continue providing quality programming with widespread school closures due to COVID-19. Understanding the burden of personal, financial, and health concerns NFTE worked closely with students to ensure they had the tools necessary to excel in this remote environment.

NFTE provides an entrepreneurship education curriculum for use at the middle and high school levels. Students participating in NFTE are engaged in a "learning by doing" model. They create business plans from their own ideas to be presented in the classroom and compete in NFTE Business Plan Competitions all over the world. Finally, winners receive funding that can be used for their business or education.

THE EDUCATION FUND





In 2020, MBF awarded \$20,000 for a fourth consecutive year to The Education Fund, an organization with a mission of maximizing every child's potential and ensuring each one graduates with every opportunity for success. The gifts were allocated to the SmartPath program, benefiting the students of Booker T. Washington Senior High School, Miami Jackson Senior High School, Miami Northwestern Senior High School and Miami Senior High School in the City of Miami.

Through this program, students participated in college clubs, with college field trips and college fairs; as well as FAFSA completion and asset mapping workshops. With MBF's support, students in these schools researched and then toured colleges and universities throughout Florida. This program helps bridge the gap between high school and college, enabling first-generation college students to successfully attend a postsecondary program. The Education Fund was able to successfully complete all college tours prior to the start of COVID-19.

In addition, 24 City of Miami SmartPath students participated in the paid Summer Internship Program. Many of the City of Miami SmartPath internship providers offered work-from-home jobs which was highly beneficial due to COVID-19. This program allows students to receive training, learn about careers, and develop workplace professionalism. "David, a graduating senior at Miami Senior High School, credits the support he gained from SmartPath for giving him a future filled with potential. He arrived with his mother in Miami



less than four years ago, speaking only Spanish. He joined College Club and participated in all SmartPath activities, including an Education Fund sourced and funded five-week internship with Keeping Your Books (an MBF client recommended for this program). Beginning this August, David will be attending Harvard University, without any out-of-pocket expenses. We could not have helped David and many of his classmates without Miami Bayside Foundation's support."

LITTLE HAITI OPTIMIST CLUB

In 2014, MBF partnered with the Little Haiti Optimist Club (LHOC), an organization that strives to impact the youth of the surrounding Little Haiti community in a positive way, to provide afterschool programs to the youths in the area. MBF's support provided opportunities for 30 additional children to take advantage of LHOC academic and life excellence programs throughout the 2014-2015 school year. In 2015 and 2017, MBF provided further support for LHOC's summer program.

In 2020, MBF awarded \$7,500 to support LHOC's Virtual Summer Camp. LHOC camp builds math, vocabulary, background knowledge in science, reading comprehension, and critical thinking skills. By working together, MBF and LHOC were able to serve 35 students, grades K-8 the summer of 2020.

LHOC was successful in launching a new online learning platform. The full-service platform is designed so that students can follow along with camp activities, connect with other students, download classroom resources, and continue their education during the current pandemic.

ST. ALBAN'S CHILD ENRICHMENT CENTER

In 2020, MBF awarded a gift of \$35,000 for a fourth consecutive year to St. Albans' Summer Literacy Program. This summer program provides quality education to 90 students from low-income families residing primarily in Coconut Grove, ensuring that they do not experience summer loss and are prepared to begin their fall schooling.

Due to the pandemic, new restrictions were put in place by the Florida Department of Children which lessened the number of children they could serve. Their staff, parents, and children followed all protocols and there were no reported COVID-19 cases during the summer.

Established in 1949, St. Alban's provides services to over 200 children annually and was the first Head Start Agency in Miami-Dade County. In March of 2016, Miami Bayside Foundation awarded a gift of \$16,890 to St. Alban's for their Technology in Education Program which enabled them to purchase seven iStartSmart computers. These stateof-the-art technology centers promote school readiness and align with National Standards, focusing on 18 skill development areas with five scaffolding levels. The new technology contributed to raising students' school readiness scores from below average to nearly 100 points above average during the 2016 school year.



"Each year St. Alban's Child Enrichment Center provides early childhood education to more than 200 children and social services to the children's families. The partnership with the Miami Bayside Foundation is one where both parties understand the importance of early childhood education. This collaborative relationship is a success, and we hope that what we exemplify demonstrates to others how working together helps those in the community."

YWCA

In 2020, MBF provided YWCA with a gift of \$15,000 for a second consecutive year to fund their six-week Summer Learning Early Childhood Education Program. The program provided 20 children, between the ages of four and five years in the Overtown community, with affordable, high-quality early childhood education. This summer program allowed YWCA to bridge the critical learning loss experienced during the summer months for low-income youth. The summer program came at a critical time due to COVID-19 school closures. All CDC guidelines were followed, and the YWCA was able to safely offer this program.




